

## STATUTES OF THE CAVALLARO MEDAL

- 1) The University of Ferrara has instituted a gold medal which is to be awarded every two years under the auspices of the European Federation of Corrosion to honour the memory of and the work accomplished by Professor Leo Cavallaro, founder of the "Aldo Dacco" Study Centre on Corrosion, an annexe of the Institute of Chemistry of the University of Ferrara. The medal will be awarded to a scientist who is particularly distinguished by his activity and his publications in the field of corrosion research.
- 2) A Jury composed of 5 members will be convened in order to examine the work of eligible scientists and to declare the winner of the medal.
- 3) The Jury will be nominated by the EFC Science and Technology Advisory Committee (STAC) and will include the Director of the "Aldo Dacco" Study Centre on Corrosion of the Institute of Chemistry of the University of Ferrara, or his nominated representative, and four others chosen from within the membership of the STAC.
- 4) The Jury members will remain in post for a single medal award.
- 5) Before 31st March in the year of the medal award, the Jury must select the winner of the award; this person will receive the medal during a ceremony to be held either in the "Aldo Dacco" Study Centre on Corrosion of the Institute of Chemistry of the University of Ferrara or, if recipient of the medal would prefer, during a symposium or a European Corrosion Conference (EUROCORR) award ceremony to be held in the autumn.
- 6) During the medal award ceremony, the recipient of the medal must make a presentation on the subject for which he has been awarded the Cavallaro medal.
