

RULES FOR THE AWARD OF THE

KURT SCHWABE PRIZE

Founded by the Hungarian Corrosion Society "HUNKOR"
and Presented by the European Federation of Corrosion

AWARD

On the initiative of the Hungarian Corrosion Society, "HUNKOR", and with the financial backing of the "Kurt Schwabe Foundation, Hungary", the "KURT SCHWABE PRIZE" has been established in honour of the late Professor Kurt Schwabe.

The award, consisting of a medal and the sum of 500 EURO, will be presented by the EFC every three years to a young scientist in recognition of his/her scientific and technical contribution to the field of corrosion on the basis of publications.

DESIGNATION OF AWARD RECIPIENT

Nominations will be sought at least 12 months before the date of presentation of the award both from the EFC Member Societies and from individuals who should submit their proposals to the EFC Secretariat, Fédération Française pour les sciences de la Chimie (FFC), 28 rue Saint-Dominique, F75007, Paris. Nominees must be below 35 years of age. Proposals should be accompanied by a list of publications and letters of support from at least three persons who are familiar with the work and contributions of the candidate. The nomination process will close on March 1st of the year of the award presentation.

The selection committee for the award should consist of one member from the Hungarian Corrosion Society, and two other members determined by the Science and Technology Advisory Committee. The selection committee should announce its recommendations to STAC by May 1st of the year of the award presentation.
